The board discussed various aspects of museum operations during the offseason. They also brainstormed ideas for the school field trip and planned historical tours for the local community.

Outline

Museum operations and upcoming events

- David discussed the Society's off-season activities, including preparation for the next busy season and maintaining a tempo close to year-round operations.
- David mentioned the Society's website calendar, which shows a lot of activity during the winter months, dispelling any idea that the Society hibernates during the off-season.
- Sally discussed the upcoming field trip for second graders and mentioned handouts showing old schools and their locations.

Historical site event planning

• David and Carol discussed using the Falmouth Festival as a historical venue to tell stories about the Tidewater.

Local history tours in Falmouth

- David outlined the results of a planning meeting for the local history tours, with four tours focusing on the 1875-1900 period, highlighting the peak of agriculture and emergence as a summer resort.
- The New Casco Village tour will have 17 stops and a total duration of around an hour and a half, with a fully scripted and annotated guide for the tour guide.
- The history tours will have multiple versions, including a guided bus tour, a narrated slideshow using a mix of contemporary and historic photographs, and a self-guided tour with turn-by-turn guides.
- David and Carol discussed upcoming events and schedule, including a practice loop for Parks and Recreation and obtaining a microphone system from Falmouth House.

Historical collections and research

- Suzanne discussed the work of the collections committee which has been meeting weekly to process the MMD collection.
- Ron described progress transcribing accession records to the database.
- David described the queries they received from the community and the addition of new content to the website.
- David discussed discoveries made possible by new online resources, including more complete and interesting tales about two homes.
- David and Carol discussed how technology has made it easier to access historical records.
